PUBLIC AND LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE REPORT NO.2 -DEC. 1995

As a follow-up to my report last month on Alternate Rail Technology (ART): MTA's board as its November 15th meeting accepted the Phase II report which stated that ART is feasible to run between Glendale/ Burbank and downtown Los Angeles. The problems I outlined last month still loom, but for now politics dictate making as if they can be fairly easily overcome.

By January a funding report for this corridor is to be prepared. Also, cities along the other corridors proposed for ART in the 20 year plan (Northern San Gabriel valley, Harbor subdivision, Exposition corridor, Burbank branch west)-are to be contacted regarding potential funding they could contribute. Is this going to become a bidding war?

Interestingly the Planning and Programming Committee did ask as an option mid-day Metrolink shuttle be considered. This is especially noteworthy because the consultants indicate ART would effectively close corridors from being converted to light rail and CNG fueling appears unlikely. So why buy new vehicles?

In the next few weeks we hope to contact media in the other corridors and ask if they know about this proposal. Our experience with the Glendale News-Bulletin indicates that smaller papers may take more interest when we contact them versus LA Times etc. (especially when there is a local angle to what we contact them about).

At each monthly meeting, I pass around for the members present to examine a file folder containing the correspondence, relevant news clippings, etc. relating to the previous months' activities of the PLAC. Over time, I hope this will provide illustration of what an active transit advocate engages in - research, advocacy, letter writing, attending meetings and networking. To reach its full potential our group needs involved and active members.

One way you could aid SO.CA.TA is to agree to place fliers publicizing it at local libraries, community centers, transit centers, etc. We can supply you with either a master to copy, or a limited stock of fliers. To let us know that you want to help write or call:


